IPHCA Creates New Public Affairs Department, Names Cyrus Winnett Chief Public Affairs Officer

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., July 19, 2023 – Today, the Illinois Primary Health Care Association (IPHCA) announces the creation of a new public affairs department, which will be led by Cyrus Winnett, who has been promoted to Chief Public Affairs Officer. The new department will include staff members from the public policy and government affairs, and communications teams.

IPHCA leverages its expertise to educate, empower and advocate for Illinois' Community Health Centers (CHC) so every person and community across the state can access the cutting-edge, compassionate care they need to thrive. He began his career with the Illinois Association of Rehabilitation Facilities where he worked on policy and advocacy efforts for persons with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities, mental illnesses and substance use disorders. He then went on to work for the Illinois Association of Medicaid Health Plans where he spearheaded Medicaid public policy conversations with public and private stakeholders.

"IPHCA has always had a government affairs team and a communications team," said Ollie Idowu, President and CEO at IPHCA. "Today, we formally bring these two groups under one umbrella to help firm up the roadmap we have for the association. Having always worked hand-in-hand, now there is a dedicated structure that will help the association move its members froward.
